School Reports

Semester one reports were sent home today (apart from 12B whose reports will be sent home tomorrow. At Albion Primary School, assessment is integral to all teaching and learning. Assessment involves the ongoing gathering and analysis of information about your child's progress. This report provides a record of student assessment including social and emotional learning. Some students with special needs have an Individual Learning Plan (ILP) for English, Mathematics, Personal Learning or a combination of all three. Their goals will be reported in an ILP format.

On Wednesday, 1st August, Parent/Teacher and Student conferences will be held to discuss student progress. These conferences are from 11:30am – 7:00pm. Information will go home early next term. However, please note that *children do not come to school for a normal school day. They only come to school for the 15 minute allocated conference time.* Over the school holidays, please take the time to look at and read through your child's report or ILP so you are ready to talk to your child's teacher about it/them. Celebrate your child's achievements, many of which are written about or visually presented in their report.
