Message from the Principal


School Photos

Cyber Safety

We had five wonderful sessions run by Sam and Trent from the Cyber Safety Project on Wednesday. Firstly, our 5/6 students learned about See, We and Me spaces, as did the children in years 3 and 4. The 'see' space is open for anyone in the world to see what is published online. The 'we' space is where you invite, request and then accept people you know into your space. The 'me' space is for 'my eyes only' and requires a password to access.



Supervision of Students in the Yard Before and After School

Staff supervise children in the *school yard* before school from 8:50 to 9:00am and after school from 3:20 to 3:35pm. Outside of these times, supervision is the responsibility of parents or

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guardians. If children want to use the playground or be in the garden with the chickens (even during the times above) they must be supervised by their own parent or guardian. Once children have been picked up in the afternoon, and they remain in the school grounds, supervision is the responsibility of the person who picked them up. Children who attend breakfast club are supervised by staff inside. At times, we also have special activities (eg. Cross country training before 8:50am) that a particular staff member will supervise but supervision is only for that activity and not the general school yard.

Building Works

We are about to go to tender for works to repair rooms 2, 3 and 4. We are hopeful that the majority of the work will take place over the next school holidays. There will most likely be some inconvenience to all of us while it is happening as the rooms and some of the outdoor space will become the builder's compound and that will be out of bounds to staff and students during that time.

The capital works will also be going to tender in the near future. This work will most likely start in the September school holidays. Once again, there will be some disruptions to all of us as the builder's compound and the areas they will be working in will be out of bounds to all of us.

It is an exciting time for the Albion Primary School community.
