The repairs to the three rooms are coming along. Room 4 is almost finished. Rooms 2 and 3 will be another few weeks.

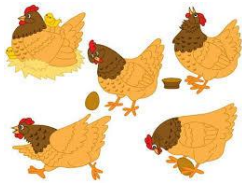
Please make sure you keep this evening free so you can be a part of the audience to support all of our students. It is always a wonderful evening and you will be amazed at the talented students we have.

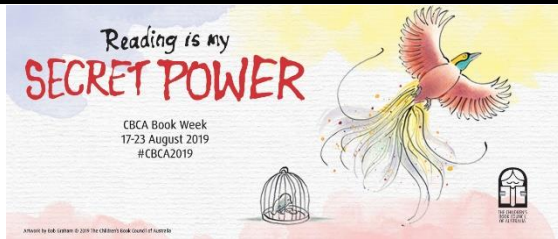
