Grant Applications

The school applies for numerous grants across the course of a year. Sometimes we are successful, sometimes we are not. This year we have been successful in five grants so far – for musical instruments, sporting schools (terms one, two and three) and Transform Us - Active Schools. We are in the process of applying for

three more — Junior Landcare, School Shade Grant and Local Schools Community Grant. Junior Landcare is to help support the biodiversity in our garden and to help create the maths garden. The other grants will help us to gain funds to go towards erecting cover over the basketball court so that we have a space where the whole school and community can assemble.

NAPLAN

Initial data from NAPLAN indicates terrific growth in our students from years 3 - 5 in The Deer reading and numeracy. park/Sunshine network senior education improvement leader was in contact with the school to congratulate us on our achievement. The results are a credit to everyone. Unfortunately, in schools, so much hangs on NAPLAN results. However, it is the only country/statewide measure that is used in terms of student outcomes even though it is only a snapshot of how the school is travelling. As a school, we need to keep the momentum going to improve our practice. If we do that, then we will always see growth in student outcomes.

Supervision of Students in the Yard Before and After School

Staff supervise children in the *school yard* before school from 8:50 to 9:00am and after school from


3:20 to 3:35pm. Outside of these times, supervision is the responsibility of parents or guardians. If children want to use the playground or be in the garden with the chickens (even during the times above) they must be supervised by their own parent or guardian. Once children have been picked up in the afternoon, and they remain in the school grounds, supervision is the responsibility of the person who picked them up. Children who attend breakfast club are supervised by staff inside. At times, we also have special activities (eg. athletics training before 8:50am) that a particular staff member will supervise but supervision is only for that activity and not the general school yard.

Money at School

Money that parents give their children to bring to school for the canteen or special occasions such as the Fathers' Day Stall is only for those children. It is important for parents to be clear with their child as to what they are to use the money for. It is also important that children understand that the money is for them and they should not be giving it to other children. Nor should children be asking other children for money. We have been talking to classes and teaching children if other children ask them for money to say, 'No. This is my money. My parents gave me this money. If you want money, you need to ask your parents. I am not allowed to give you mine.' If a child continues to ask your child for money, students have been taught to then tell their teacher about it so it can be dealt with straight away. I would ask that you have a conversation with your child and reinforce the statement we are teaching our students and have them practise it at home with you. If you do send money to school with your child, please make sure they know and understand what they are allowed to use the money for.
