Message from the Principal

Pupil Free Day

Our final pupil free day for the year is on Monday 4th November. Students are not required at school on this day. I apologise that this was not included in the calendar dates in the last newsletter. Tuesday 5th November is a public holiday and the school will be closed.

2020 Planning

We are starting the organisation of classes for next year. I ask parents to let the school know if their child(ren) is/are not returning to Albion Primary School next year. Accurate numbers are crucial for our planning. This of course does not apply to our Year 6 students who will be going on to secondary school in 2020.

If you have a child who is commencing foundation (prep) in 2020, please make sure

you enrol your child. Only children who have enrolled participate in the K – F transition. Similarly, if you know of anyone who is intending to send their child to Albion Primary School in 2020, please let them know that they need to enrol their child as quickly as possible.

2020 Foundation (Prep) Student Transition

It is always a very exciting (and sometimes anxious) time when students come to school for the very first time. Transition programs help with a smooth start to school.

Our K – F transition sessions start in November. As stated above, only children who have enrolled are able to attend the transition sessions.

We look forward to meeting our new students and welcoming them to the Albion Primary School community.

Grant Applications – Junior Land Care Grant

As mentioned in the previous newsletter, the school applies for a number of grants. At the end of term, we were informed that the school was successful in receiving a grant of \$4653 to go towards the creation of an outdoor indigenous-butterfly-bee-bird-sensory-maths garden in the west corner of our school.

We hope to improve biodiversity through the development of this garden by restoring and improving the natural habitat for native butterflies, bees and birds. We want to create a nature trail that will educate and engage the students in nature, maths and their five senses. There will be interpretive signage along the trail to inform and raise awareness of the

benefits and importance of creating biodiversity and a healthy environment. There will also be in-class learning activities to complement the garden.

We also recently received donations of vegetable seedlings and some indigenous plants. They are currently being planted around the school.

We are looking at holding a school community working bee during the term to continue work on this project. If you are interested in being involved please let us know by adding your name to a list at the office.

Holiday Works

Lots of things happened over the school holidays - line marking (part of the Transform Us grant we received), flag pole installation, and the moving of rooms in readiness for the capital works.

The art room is temporarily in room 12 (old 3/4A room), Italian and Music in room 13 (old 3/4B room) and the office will be moving very soon into room 4 (near the current 3/4 rooms) in the original building.

A special thank you to staff who have been and will continue to be very flexible in their ability to teach in all manner of situations and places.

At the last school council meeting, council approved the installation of three new flag poles. They were installed during the school holidays. They have been placed so that they will be facing the entrance to the school after the upcoming capital works are complete. We are pleased that we can now fly the three national flags – the Australian, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander flags.



Parent Information



At Albion Primary School, staff are always happy to talk to parents about their children, and about

what is happening in the school. We value everyone's input and want you to feel comfortable in approaching the staff.

If you require an interpreter, we are able to organise onsite interpreters at a mutually convenient time or telephone interpreters on call. Schools use the Victorian Interpreting and Translation Services (VITS).

Supervision of Students in the Yard Before and After School

Staff supervise children in the *school yard* before school from 8:50 to 9:00am and after school from

3:20 to 3:35pm. Outside of these times, supervision is the responsibility of parents or guardians. If children want to use the playground or be in the garden with the chickens (even during the times above) they must be supervised by their own parent or guardian. Once children have been picked up in the afternoon, and they remain in the school grounds, supervision is the responsibility of the person who picked them up. Children who attend breakfast club are supervised by staff inside. At times, we also have special activities (eg. athletics training before 8:50am) that a particular staff member will supervise but supervision is only for that activity and not the general school yard.


