## Supervision of Students in the Yard Before and After School

Staff supervise children in the *school yard* before school from 8:50 to 9:00am and after school from 3:20 to 3:35pm. Outside of these times, supervision is the responsibility of parents or guardians. If children want to use the playground or be in the garden with the chickens (even during the times above) they must be supervised by their own parent or guardian. Once children have been picked up in the afternoon, and they remain in the

school grounds, supervision is the responsibility of the person who picked them up. Children who attend breakfast club are supervised by staff inside. At times, we also have special activities (eg. athletics training before 8:50am) that a particular staff member will supervise but supervision is only for that activity and not the general school yard. Ball games are not permitted before and after school.

## **Student Leadership**

## **House Captains**

Albion Primary School has a strong tradition of house competitions. Our houses are Blue House, Gold House, Green House and Red House. Each house has elected house captains – usually year 5 and/or 6 students.

Each student is placed into a house group based on their age. We try to have the house groups as evenly balanced as we can in terms of gender and the number of students in each age group. Siblings are placed in the same house.

There are lunch time house sporting competitions (for example: paper aeroplanes, house basketball, house dodgeball, house rugby). Students are able to represent their house in these competitions. We also have a school athletics day when students represent their house to compete in track and field events. The winning house is presented with the Albion Primary School House Athletics Shield. As well as sporting competitions between the houses, the house captains are planning other sorts of activities such as music and dance competitions. Each house also competes to gain house points for a variety of reasons. The winning house is presented with the house shield at our annual awards evening.

House captains are assigned areas of responsibility each term and it is up to the house captains to organise themselves to carry out these responsibilities.

At the end of each year, students in years 4 and 5 have the opportunity to nominate themselves for the house captain role for the following year. The new captains are announced at the school's annual awards evening.

### **School Council News**

A reminder that there are three parent positions vacant this year. There will also be a casual vacancy to fill for one year due to the resignation of one of the parent members. Current members of the school council are able to stand for reelection.

The timeline for the process is as follows:

- Monday 24<sup>th</sup> February Close of nominations 4:00pm
- Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> February List of candidates and nominators will be displayed
- Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> March Ballot papers distributed (only if number of nominations exceeds number of vacancies)
- Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> March Close of ballot
- Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> March Counting of votes and declaration of ballot
- Monday 16<sup>th</sup> March Meeting to co-opt Community Members and the first meeting of the new School Council

Nomination are available from the office up to and including Monday 24<sup>th</sup> February at 3:59pm.

There may be times when decisions taken do not suit everyone but please be assured that we use the guiding principle of 'what is best for the children?' when making them.

## **Car Park**

The car park is for *staff parking only*.

Children are not permitted to walk through the carpark, even with adults. Your children are taught this rule at school and we often see and hear children tell the adult they are with that they are not allowed to go through the car park, but the adult takes them anyway. We have cars going in and out of the car park all throughout the day. It is not a safe practice. Please help your child to do the right thing by following this school rule.

Parking is available for drop-offs and pick-ups in Adelaide, Albury, and Derrimut Streets. Children are to use the pedestrian gates for entry and exit to the school. The only exception is for staff who have students at the school.

### **School Crossing**

We are noticing, and have had reports, that a number of children are crossing Adelaide Street at the speed hump at the Australia Post letter box outside the Kindergarten rather than using the much safer option of the school crossing. If you or your child/children are crossing Adelaide Street or parking on the opposite side to the school in Adelaide Street, please use the school crossing. Parents, please remind your children to use the crossing and model this behaviour if you are with them. Teachers have been asked to also remind students of this important safety issue.

## **Building Works**

While the ceiling, floor and painting of the corridor in Block C is being done, we have had to temporarily move the 5/6 classes into the Library. This has affected our library program. Mrs Tikulin is teaching her classes in the classrooms until this work is complete. Music classes are also 'roaming'. We have also had to suspend student and family borrowing during this time. Hopefully the Library will be back to normal by the start of March and our year 5/6 classes will be back in their classrooms. In the meantime, I thank everyone for their understanding during the disruptions that the building works are creating.

The school has a *Riding to School – Bicycle and Scooter* policy. Albion Primary School is a bicycle

education school with children in years 4-6 participating in the program using the school's bikes. The promotion of safe riding practices is part of the program.

If children want to ride their own bike or scooter to school, parents need to complete a student application for riding to school. They can be obtained from the office. As part of the application, bikes and scooters are name tagged so that we know which parents have signed the application.

Some children have had their applications accepted but have yet to ride their bike or scooter to school and therefore, do not have their bike/scooter tags. Let Mrs Williamson know when you next ride to school so the tag can be put on the bike/scooter. If you have a new bike or scooter and have already have accepted application, you will need a new tag for your bike or scooter.

Weekly specials will be on offer. This week's was Chop Suey. Next week's will be Honey Soy Chicken and rice for \$4.50.


Keep your eye on the board at the front of the canteen for future specials. The canteen is open on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.
